City Campus Venues:

Each City Campus class is designated as either Adelaide St or Creek St in the class description. The Creek St venue is on the ground floor at 97 Creek St. The Adelaide St venue is on the 5th floor at 232 Adelaide St, adjacent to Anzac Square. Allocated room numbers are displayed on the digital signage at each venue.

Class Fees

Classes in the City Campus venues (Creek St and Adelaide St) are \$5 per session unless otherwise indicated. Class fees for computer classes in the Creek St lab are shown as a cost for the full duration of the course, which must be paid in advance in the first week. Computer classes in other rooms may be shown as a weekly fee. Classes at other venues are free of charge unless indicated.

To attend any classes, you must be a current financial member of U3A Brisbane (\$40 per year).

Class Enrolments

You can enrol in a class using *Class Search* on the U3A website, or by contacting the tutor directly. To re-enrol in an existing class, you may use the Member Dashboard. If you enrol online you may assume that your enrolment is accepted unless the tutor advises otherwise. Your U3A Brisbane Membership card must be produced when you attend your first class. If you subsequently find that you cannot attend the course, please advise the tutor so that your place may be offered to another member.

Computer Classes at Creek St.

All students enrolling for Intermediate or Advanced classes are expected to have appropriate prior knowledge. All applicants for any computer course should have access to a computer and bring a USB memory stick to classes.
