Those of us on the organising committee for the Winter School are hard at work filling the session slots with a wide

variety of well-credentialled and interesting speakers. The week is already looking great!

Existing U3A Brisbane members are well aware of Winter School and look forward to it every year but new members are probably asking, "What is Winter School?"

The current model of Winter School started from small beginnings about 11 years ago, the brainchild of Anne Douglass, who grew it from those small beginnings to the wonderfully stimulating and interesting week that it is now. In 2016, we offered 50 sessions. Anne has now retired as coordinator but is still hard at work as a committee member.

It is held during the June/July school holidays during 3 timeslots in 4 rooms from Monday to Friday. On the Monday, sessions are held in the morning followed by our keynote speaker at 2pm. This takes place in the Qld State Library Auditorium, a venue which holds almost 300 people.

This year the cost of attending the session of the

keynote speaker has been raised to \$10. We always lost money on the keynote session, despite the high profile speakers, because of the cost of hiring the facility. This seems not to be sensible when the aim of Winter School is to raise money which directly benefits members.

Attendance otherwise is \$5 per session. Sessions run for around an hour at 9.00am, 11.00am and 1.00pm. This year, Winter School runs from Monday 3 July to Friday 7 July. The speakers and their topics are advertised in the weeks leading up to this date. Read your E-news and check out our Facebook site. Non U3A members may also attend.

The program is released online on an advertised date to all members who have supplied an email address and places, which can be applied for online, fill very quickly. It's a busy, bustling, fabulous week. Make sure you are part of it.

We are fortunate to have so many talented members that are happy to share their knowledge and become new tutors with U3A. In Term 2 we have a multitude of new classes on offer in the following categories:

Our classrooms are set up with the number of chairs to fit in each room. If a tutor needs to "borrow" chairs from another room, then at the end of the class they need to return the "borrowed" chairs back to the classroom they came from. It is not the job of the Administration Staff to be moving chairs from room to room, so it would be appreciated if Tutors show consideration and leave their classroom as they found it.
