Loan Chow YHC Lawyers: Effective estate planning

Wednesday 24 May 11am-12:30pm. Greg Taylor, U3A: Raspberry Pi 400, a low-cost alternative to a conventional PC.

The Raspberry Pi 400 is a complete personal computer built into a compact keyboard and only costs about \$170. It features a quad-core 64-bit processor, 4GB RAM, WiFi, gigabit Ethernet, Bluetooth, dual-monitor (4K) capability, three USB ports and 4K video playback. The kit comes with a mouse and power supply, so all you need to add is a HDMI monitor or



TV as a display. It was released in 2021 as the latest in a series of single-board computers that started with a very basic board in 2012. It is now a fully-functional desktop PC that can run many different variants of the Linux operating system.

In this presentation we will do a live demonstration of the Pi 400, showcasing its usefulness for web browsing, email, document preparation, image manipulation and other applications. The presentation will be useful for anyone interested in a low-cost computer for home or office use, or for those curious about computers in general.

Although many will be unfamiliar with the Linux OS, you will observe that it is easier to use than Windows or Mac OS X in most respects.

Greg Taylor is U3A Brisbane's ICT Coordinator. He was a software developer for most of his career and developed U3A Brisbane's online management system that is integrated with our website.
