## 2. What laws does Australia have?



- Racial Discrimination Act 1975 (Cth) sections 18C: 'offend, insult, humiliate or intimidate', and 18D: exemptions
- Anti-Discrimination Act 1977 (NSW) race, transgender/gender identity, homosexuality, HIV/AIDS: 'incite hatred towards, serious contempt for, or severe ridicule of.
- NSW model followed relatively closely in Qld, Vic, Tas, and ACT.
- SA a criminal provision + a civil liability tort provision never used.
- WA idiosyncratic criminal provisions.
